BRING BULLYING TO BAY
with

COMMUNICATION — ACTION — RESPECT — EMPATHY

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Research indicates that a mix of individual and community action can significantly diminish, even eliminate, bullying at the elementary school level (*intimidation*, stealing, spreading gossip or malicious lies, direct verbal abuse, physical bullying, prevention of individual involvement in school activities, etc.) and even outside school grounds (cyber-bullying and physical intimidation or abuse).

Jim Cogan's *Bring Bullying to Bay* wraps prevention strategies into an easy to remember code all children can remember **C.A.R.E.**

C. Communication:

The first major prevention step is to recognize bullying for what it is and talk about it with someone who can help stop it. Bullying can be described as "negative, hurtful actions, often repeated, by a single person or a group toward a person who has difficulty defending himself or herself. It is almost always intended to cause physical, emotional or social harm to the victim. Cyber-bullying is a particularly malicious form of bullying.

Jim makes this point clear in all his programs: Know what bullying is and know that you always have someone with whom you can discuss the problem and get help.

A: Action:

A second strategy is action: action to protect yourself and action others can take to help you and the community. A bully knows that a community of students and adults who take a stand, who refuse to stand idly by while bullying takes place, who know how to enforce rules and how to protect every individual's right to be free from harassment is not a place where bullying can be tolerated. If there are no bystanders, there will be few if any isolated victims as all in the community will respond swiftly and strongly to such an assault on school values and personal safety. Jim also uses his stories to outline various ways to avoid being the target of a bully and actions one can take to neutralize it if it occurs.

R. Respect

A third strategy is positive: a school that teaches and rewards respect will likely have fewer problems with bullies as such a climate is, in itself, anti-bullying, pro-acceptance, and pro-active in defending such school values. Jim uses audience participation, role playing and pauses in his stories to emphasize the effectiveness of building a community based on acceptance, tolerance and respect.

E. Empathy

Perhaps the most useful of all strategies to combat bullying is teaching students about the power of empathy (the ability to understand, feel, be concerned about another's situation) for it build's in every student an innate capacity to CARE. Bullying should not be tolerated or go unnoticed in a community of empathetic individuals. Bullies will quickly realize they have no place to hide and no audience to please. Students will explore the causes of bullying and develop strategies to bring it to bay.
